ADULT/MASTERS CLUB MEMBER TRAINING

Tracy Gorzek did a great job facilitating the November 11th USSA Ski Technique Video Night for the general club membership at Wausau West. She used the USSA CD to cover both classic & skate technique. Discussion questions consisted of how technique has evolved and what is now considered the most powerful positions/techniques to use in your skiing. There were suggested warm up drills demonstrated that you can use in your first 10 minutes of skiing to help you increase your skills. We had 24 people in attendance that walked away with some new ideas on how to increase their performance as well as how to coach others. The club is going to purchase a CD that we can lend out to those who missed the presentation. (If you are wondering how you missed this event - it was advertised through the club email system as the October newsletter was already printed)

The SNEKKEVIK 2009

Ministry Health Care (3rd year) and River Valley State Bank (1st year) are sponsoring the Club's Snekkevik Ski Event this year which will be held on Saturday, January 17th... There will be both classic and skate races (timed so adults can do both). The sponsorship money will provide the merchandise drawings that have been so popular the last couple of years. Remember – entry to the event makes you eligible for the merchandise drawings, however you must be present when your name is called! Timing will be provided/donated by our club member John Burke who owns Performance Timing. Age placement will be posted, but random drawings will determine WINNERS of merchandise. Awards will be given to Middle School and High School athletes, but not to adult age division winners. Participants can also look forward to a new course if snow conditions permit.

NEW this year is a *noncompetitive* TOUR division that will not be timed, but entrants will pay an event fee which WILL make them eligible for the merchandise drawings. Tour participants will be on a separate course from the timed racers. ALSO NEW will be a reduced entry fee for club members.

So what can't you like about this event? Support your club by racing, touring, volunteering, or spectating. All are welcome!

Snekkevik Future

This is the last year I will be race director for the Snekkevik. The next two years (2010 & 2011) Wausau will be hosting the WI High/Middle School State Championships the 2nd weekend in February, so my time will be devoted to that endeavor. The event has been in the black over the last 5 years and entry fees have remained low due to the fact we have sought sponsorship to defray the ever increasing costs. Badger State Games Quadrathlon 2009

For the second consecutive year, the Quadrathlon will be held at Nine Mile Forest, on January 25, 2009 at 8:00AM. The Quad has been part of the Badger State Winter Games for 15 years. Initially it was held at Sylvan Hills Ski Area and the American Legion Golf Course.

This event consists of four 5k events: 5k run, 5k mountain bike, 5k snowshoe and 5k cross country ski. It can be done with four-person teams, pairs, or as individuals. We have been encouraging family teams and high school teams to participate. Age groups are 16-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59 and 60+, with women's categories separate from co-ed/male categories.

When held at Sylvan Hills, the run and bike were done on the hilly roads surrounding the area, and the bike finished down the service road beside the ski slopes. There were a few crashes on the way down, and several years where we opted to ride back on the roads due to icy conditions. The year we had the 50+ degree weather for BSG winter games weekend, the snow melted off the bridge on our ski course and we had to improvise a shortened course.

For our inaugural year at Nine Mile Forest, in 2008, we had the 5k run on a snowmobile trail east of Red Bud Road. Many of the participants found the running to be challenging due to the soft snow conditions, as snowmobiles had traveled on the trail during the night though it had been closed for our event. We will decide where to hold the run in 2009 with those factors in mind. The 5k bike couldn't be run on the same course because it was so soft, and was held on Red Bud Road out and back. The 5k snowshoe was held on the Leo's Loop trail, and was fantastic. The 5k ski was on the 6k loop with modifications. We had the transition area in the opening near the maintenance building west of the chalet, with bike stanchions set up there. We had great timing by Performance Timing, with John Burke providing splits for the four segments of the Quad.

We were very fortunate to have members of our Wausau Nordic Ski Club both as participants and volunteers for our 2008 Quadrathlon. It was fantastic to send out volunteers on the course who knew how to get to the location of their assignments. I encourage club members and anyone who is interested in challenging themselves and their friends to register for this event. It is meant for the citizen skiers as well as the more competitive skiers. We have had participants who wanted to challenge themselves following a significant illness or injury.

Get your team together and sign up online for the Quadrathlon scheduled for Sunday, January 25, 2009. It is lots of fun, and the location makes it ideal! Please call Jeanne Alexejun at (715)359-7578 with any questions.

Wausau Nordic Receives Birkie Grant

14 Projects received American Birkebeiner Skier Development Grants this year and Wausau Nordic was one of the 14!! The Birkie Foundation had 36 applicants for the \$12,500 in grant funding available. The ABSF Skier Development grants fund the creation or expansion of youth skier programs, purchase of "loaner" ski equipment for participants, purchase of ski hats and uniforms to foster team building and participation, and reduction of participant travel costs to ski events and clinics. Wausau Nordic received Grant money in 2006 for the Night Glider Program and the Wausau East/West HS Team was also a recipient of Birkie Grant money that year through a separate grant writing request. Our programs have grown and we are very proud that the Birkie Foundation has recognized our work and granted our request again this year.

Badger State Winter Games Food Tales

Over the past 20 years I've been involved with the food concessions at the Badger State games.....and through the years a few weird, unexpected and humorous events have occurred . These are the most memorable to me as I think back....

Before I bought par-boiled brats for the games, I used to boil them myself the week before, in a Nesco cooker out in my garage. One year I pretty much cooked all of them in one night. As they were cooked, I packed them into heavy zip-lock bags, placed them into the cardboard boxes they came in, and then dug a huge hole in a snow bank and buried them, as they would not fit in my freezer. I finished up late that evening, and went into the house to watch some late T.V. My wife Sue had just came home from a meeting and I told her what I had accomplished, and how I dealt with the brats for storage until the weekend. Her being a Home Ec. teacher, she proceeded to tell me that the meat was probably still warm, and not freezing fast enough because I put them all together in one box, and I should go out and check on them.... if they didn't cool down fast enough, bacteria could start forming. So, I reluctantly went outside and dug the suckers up out of the snow bank.! Mind you, it was about 10 above zero, we had about 2 feet of snow on the ground, and it's around midnight. You can imagine my reaction when I found the brats at just about eating temperature. Panic stricken, I quickly pulled all the baggies out of the boxes, and spread them out on my driveway to fast freeze them. About an hour later, I put them all back in the boxes again, this time frozen, and then stacked them in my garage. The next morning, Sue talked to one of her associates at work who had a brother that was a corporate food scientist. He was consulted, and I was given a clean bill of health... only because I had sealed them up into baggies. I said nothing of this to anyone until late Sunday afternoon of the games, as I still had visions of people becoming violently ill and having to be treated for food poisoning. It goes without saying that Chairman Zimbric was especially pleased, and I planned on purchasing real par-boiled brats for the next year!

Another year, we decided to have more Nescos on hand so we could keep up with the rush for hot veggie chili. A board member told us her church would be more than happy to lend us some extra cookers, and she would set it up for myself and Al Limberg (club president at the time, and famous Hans Berg Award winner) to pick them up on the Friday before the games. On Friday morning, Al and I made the rounds picking up all the stuff needed for the weekend. We went to St Anne's, walked in like we owned the place, and announced we were there for the Nescos. The cooks pointed us to the storage room, and we packed up the trailer with our haul, and headed to 9 mile. On Sunday afternoon things were winding down, and the board member who turned us onto the cookers, was wondering where they were....she was going to take them home, clean them, and return them to her church. I said she was looking at them, as they had the name of the church clearly written on them with black! magic marker...St. Anne's church. She then informed me that her church was St. Andrew's.....oops. She still was nice enough to take them home, clean them, and deliver them to their rightful home.
